

Table Cloth Covering

All members are to have their tables covered, to the floor on all sides. You may use any dark color such as navy, black, maroon, grey, etc. All side tables or bins must also be covered, hidden under the table or taken out to the car after unloading. (See information in the TCG By-laws). A different color or lace runner may be used as long as it does not hang over the front more than 12 inches. NO signage is to be attached to the front or sides of the table cover. **All signage must be on the table or behind.**

What you will need

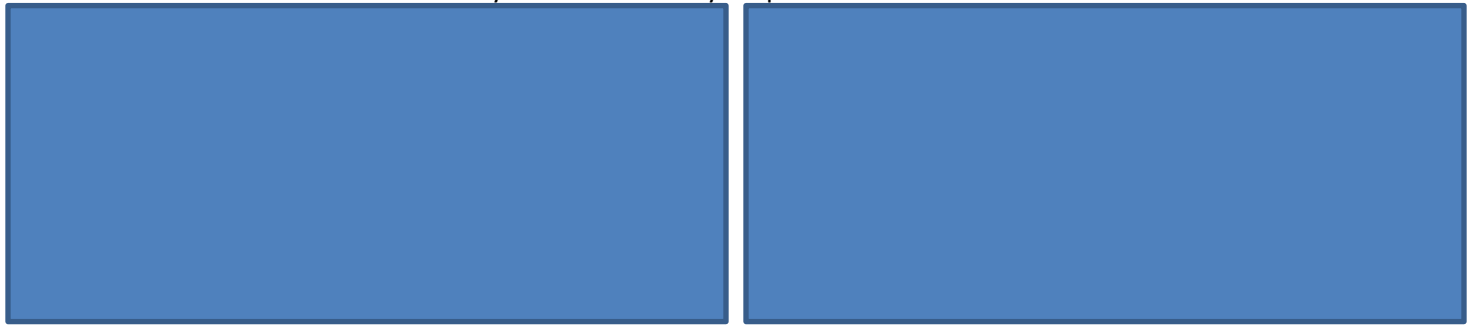
Five yards of the dark 100% polyester fabric. Make sure you get the 60 Inch wide. It does not ravel. (Cut into two 2 ½ yard lengths). This will cover an eight foot table. Now Place the material at each end of the table and open them up. They will touch the floor in front and back. Overlap the pieces in the center a bit and pin them. Please use safety pins as straight pins have become a safety liability. Pin each end like gift wrap. Ask any board member if you need help.

This is a long time, standing Toledo Craftsman's Guild guideline and must be observed. You can also make or have someone make a fitted cover for you using around eight yards. There are also several internet sites that offer fitted covers to purchase. They usually arrive pretty wrinkled so you will want to launder them prior to use.

Please avoid spandex table covers as they do not reach the floor. They are not Guild approved.



For an 8' table: Start with 5 yards of 100% polyester "ponte". Make sure you get the 60" wide. Also make sure it is the kind that does not ravel. Cut in half. Now you have two 2 ½ yard pieces.



Fold 

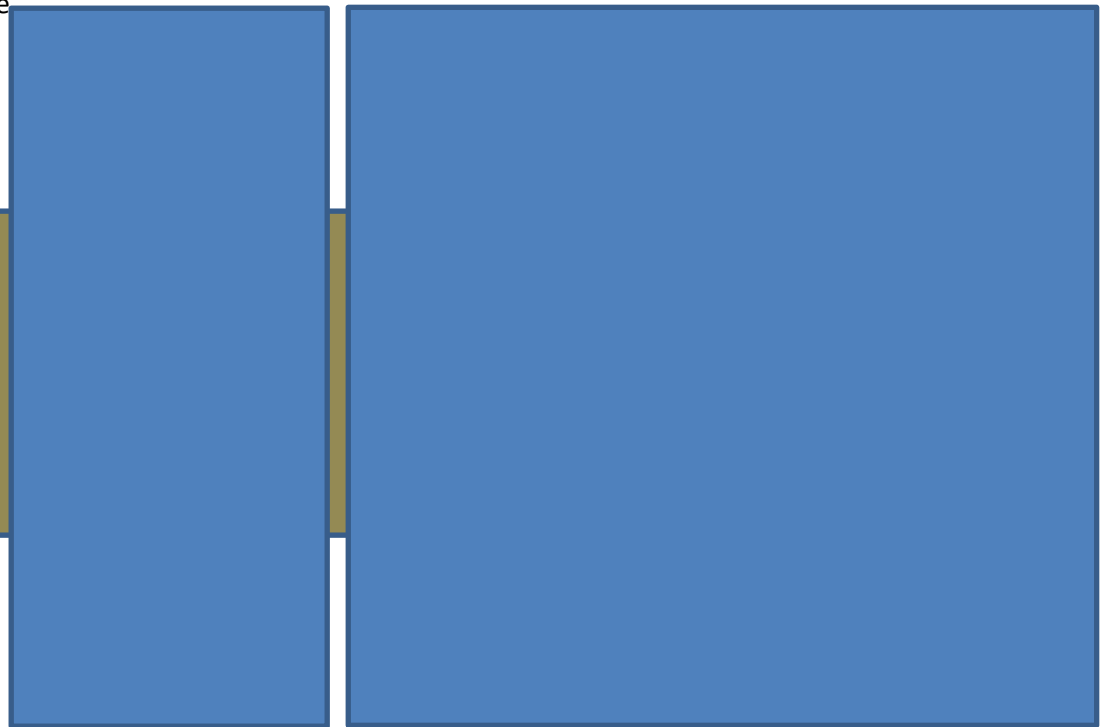


Turn the piece long wise and place over your 8' table. Open up, pin in the center using safety pins.

This will cover your table front to back, touching the floor on both sides.



Cut edge



Move to the end of the table and draw up the excess, front to back. Line up the edge so the bottom still touches the floor. Sort of crossing over like a gift wrap. Pin again using safety pins. Draw up the other side back to front and pin. Do the same with the other end. Try to keep the pins hidden as much as possible. The use of straight pins creates a safety hazard so please avoid using them.

You can also make a fitted table cover, or have one made for you. Keep your covers clean and neat by laundering between shows. You may also use table runners or accent pieces on your table top but they cannot hang over the edges more than 12 inches.
